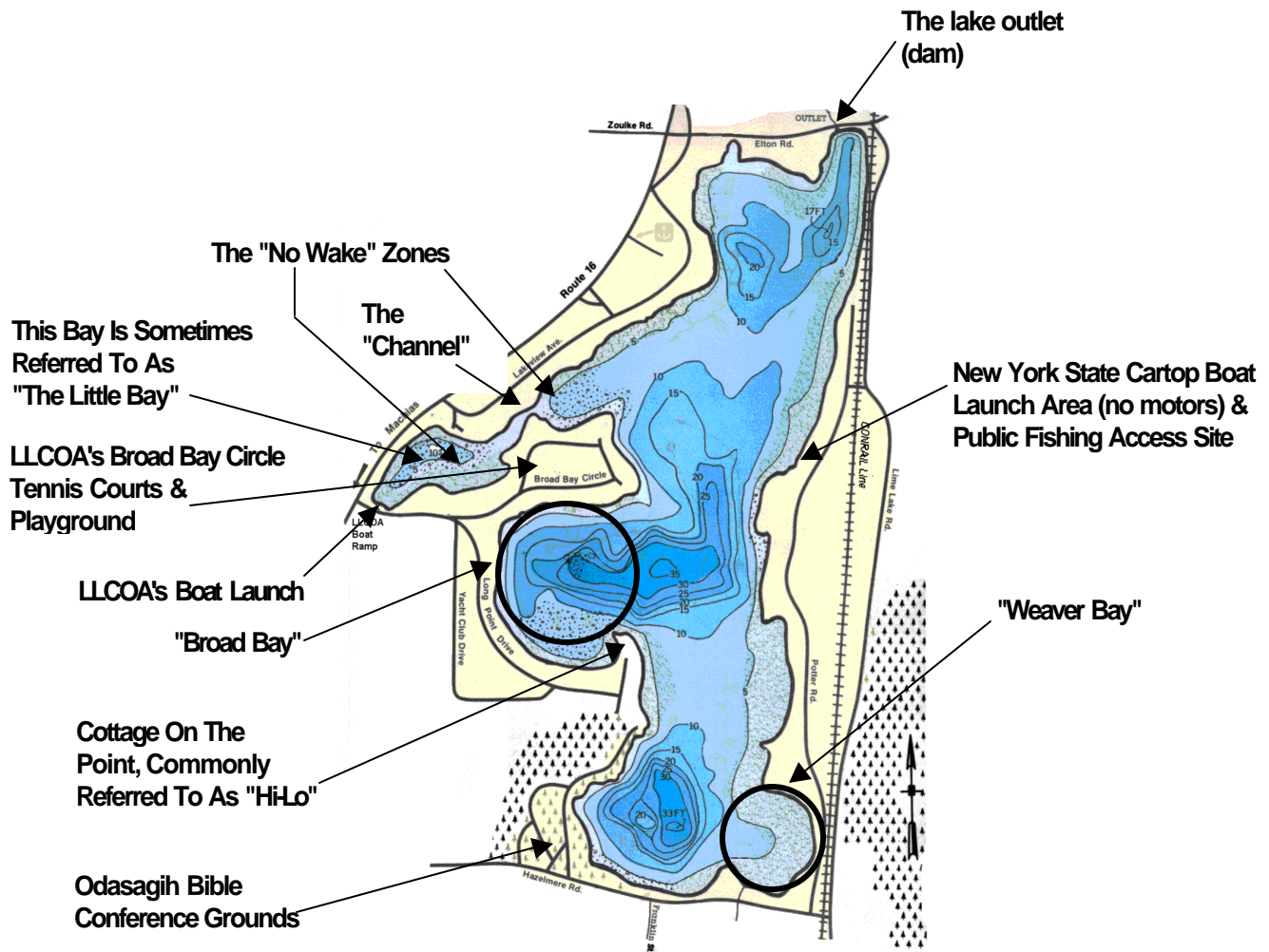


Lime Lake Newcomers' Information

STUMPS AND OBSTRUCTIONS CAN RUIN YOUR DAY ON THE LAKE!

The other day, I spent a few hours watching boats and Personal Watercraft on the lake. It was apparent that a lot of boaters don't know where the underwater stumps and other obstructions are on our lake. I have to wonder if they are friends of cottage owners (because, of course, conscientious owners would first check out these areas at a reasonable speed).

If these powerboats are being operated by friends of yours, please adhere to this advice: **Don't send them out on the lake without first talking to them about the dangers.** I've seen operators of Personal Watercraft "fly" through areas of stumps and other debris – totally oblivious to the potential danger to craft *and life*. Some of these obstructions are only a few inches deep!

While we all want our friends to have a good time here at the lake, please encourage them to use care in unfamiliar waters.

This map identifies some of the areas in which dangerous stumps and obstructions exist. Please take time to review it and show it to your visiting friends. *Let's keep it a safe summer!*
